

What Role Does Social Media Play in Your Faith Life?

Dear Parishioners,

I came across an article which posed this very question. Social media, like most things, can be used and abused at the same time. One positive way to use social media is by accessing it for our faith life. For example, how many use the Parish App or check out Parish events on-line? Do you know that there is a special Pope App?

I know some of us prefer things the old fashioned way - print. And that's fine but we know more and more young people use social media for all kinds of things to communicate, for homework, to share the latest news. Yes, it can also be used in a destructive way gossip, online bullying, pornography, etc. One of the beautiful aspects of our Catholic tradition is to appropriate what culture and technology have to offer and use it for the good. In other words, we don't have to reject social media altogether because of its negative features. We can use it as a positive instrument for transmitting the teachings of our faith and for encouraging positive Gospel values in our lives. Moreover, social media can be an effective tool in a variety of ways: creating discussion groups on relevant topics of faith; reaching out to Catholics who attend Mass infrequently; and attracting non-Catholics who are searching for the truth.

The work of evangelizing, that is bringing people to Christ, can occur in so many ways, but the ultimate aim is the same - to have a personal and spiritual encounter with the Lord. To that end, social media can have a positive impact for our faith life.
