

World Day of the Prayer for the Poor

Dear Parishioners:

November 14, 2021 marks the Fifth Annual World Day of the Poor. In 2017, Pope Francis suggested the Catholic Church set aside one day each year when communities can "reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel." He designated this day as the World Day of the Poor, and it will be celebrated on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time each year.

In this year's World Day of the Poor message, Pope Francis reflects on Psalm 9:19, "The hope of the poor will not perish forever." He considers the suffering of millions of people who experience poverty, noting that they maintain hope in the Lord in a very real way because he assures them of his faithfulness. Pope Francis challenges us to be authentic witnesses of Christian hope and to accompany the poor through a personal and constant commitment over time.

What can we do? We can pray for a just society whereby the concerns of the poor remain a priority for national and local governments. We can support worthwhile charities like the St. Vincent de Paul through our generosity. We can also get involved by joining such worthwhile organizations in order to help those who need it the most. Above all, let us be mindful of the Holy Father's exhortation to all believers: "I ask all Christian communities, and all those who feel impelled to offer hope and consolation to the poor, to help ensure that this World Day of the Poor will encourage more and more people to cooperate effectively so that no one will feel deprived of closeness and solidarity. May you always treasure the words of the prophet who proclaims a different future: 'For you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings.'(Malachi 3:20)."
