

# **October – Month of the Rosary**

## New Canonized Saints and Shepherds

In the midst of the World Synod of Bishops and delegates on Youth and Vocation in the life of the Church in Rome, Pope Francis will preside over a solemn Mass of Canonization on October 14. Among the saints to be recognized will be two great pastors and shepherds of the 20th century: Blessed Pope Paul VI and Blessed Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero. Both men are not only recognized for their deep-seated faith and piety, but for their extraordinary pastoral care and dedication to God's people. Paul VI helped usher along the reforms of the Council of Vatican II so that the Church could engage with the modern world through active listening and dialogue. His pontificate lasted from 1963-1978. Archbishop Romero was appointed Archbishop of San Salvador, El Salvador during the height of the civil conflict and political repression that engulfed his nation in the 1970s. He was first perceived as a "safe" choice, one who would not rock the boat. But he could not remain silent and so he challenged both sides to lay down their weapons and engage in peaceful dialogue. Romero's refusal to remain silent would cost him his life as he was martyred for the faith precisely at the moment that he presided over the celebration of the Eucharist.
