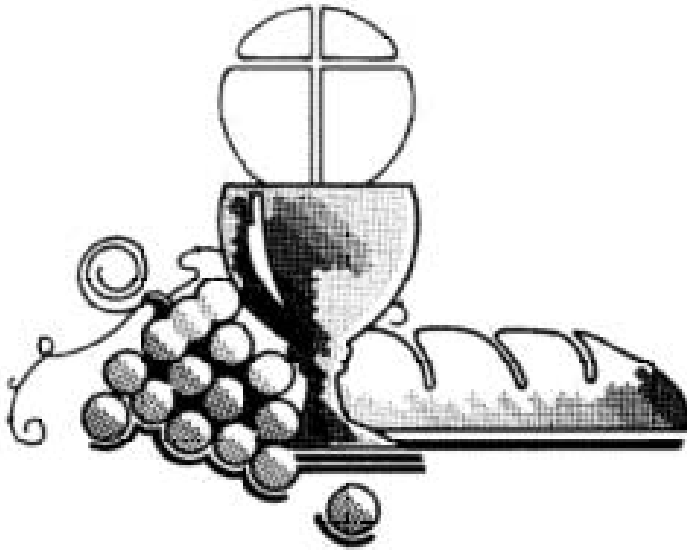

**Thought for the week**

**XXX Sunday in Ordinary Time October 29, 2023**

EX22:20-26; PS18:2-4, 47, 51; 1THES 1:5C-10; MT 22:34-40

Today’s readings are all about love — the radical love of God for His people and the radical love we are called to live out in response. The stewardship way of life is nothing more and nothing less than the practical application of loving God and neighbor in our daily lives. Jesus sums up the message of all the prophets, as well as the purpose of all God’s laws in today’s Gospel passage, from Matthew. It is a message we have likely grown-up hearing — but it is so beautiful and so challenging, it bears repeating again and again. It is Christ’s response to a question about which commandment is greatest. His answer reveals both the greatest and the second greatest commandments. He says, “You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind... The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself.” How is the second like the first? What do the two commands have in common? Love. Love God first and love neighbor as self. This is the heart of the stewardship way of life — simple enough for a child to understand, challenging enough to be the life’s work of every “grown-up.”

**Solemnity of All Saints, November 1**

The Church celebrates all the saints: canonized or beatified, and the multitude of those who are in heaven enjoying the beatific vision that are only known to God. From the first centuries after Christ, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered saints, who live in God's presence forever. Every year, on the anniversary of the martyrs' deaths, Christians would visit their tombs and celebrate the Eucharist. This practice grew throughout the centuries to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. Soon the entire calendar was filled with memorials of the saints. In the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1<sup>st</sup> as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence. What must we do in order to join the company of the saints in heaven? We "must follow in His footsteps and conform to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. We must devote ourselves with all our being to the glory of God and the service of our neighbour. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history" (*Lumen Gentium*, 40).

**All Souls Day, November 2**

The Church, after rejoicing yesterday with those of her children who have



entered the glory of heaven, today prays for all those who, in the purifying suffering of Purgatory await the day when they will be joined to the company of saints. At no place in the liturgy is stated in more striking fashion the mysterious union between the Church triumphant, the Church militant and the Church suffering; at no time is there accomplished in clearer fashion the twofold duty of charity and justice deriving for every Christian from the fact of his incorporation in the mystical Body of Christ. By virtue of the consoling doctrine of the communion of saints, the merits, and prayers of each one are able to help all; and the Church is able to join her prayer with that of the saints in heaven and supply what is wanting to the souls in Purgatory by means of the Mass, indulgences and the alms and sacrifices of her children. It was St. Odilo, fourth abbot of Cluny, who was responsible for the institution of the general commemoration of all the faithful departed. He instituted it and fixed its celebration on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the day after All Saints day. The practice spread to the rest of Christendom. Daily in a special Memento in the Canon of the Mass, at which the priest remembers all those who have fallen asleep in the Lord, the priest implores God to grant them a place of happiness, light, and peace. Thus, there is no Mass in which the Church does not pray for the faithful departed; but today her thoughts are directed towards them in a particular fashion. We pray for the liberation of the souls in Purgatory.



Almighty and everlasting God, You gave us Saints so that we can honor You by recognizing Your redemptive work in them, and that we have shining examples and powerful intercessors in our lives. They received blessings and righteousness from You because they belonged to a generation that sought only You. Allow me today to appreciate them for their past merits and their present prayers offered in the sight of Your divine majesty, so that my life too may become an oblation pleasing to You. Amen.



Lord, on this All Souls Day, let me remember those who are now preparing to meet You. You gave us the spiritual and corporal works of mercy so that we might look after our brothers and sisters, both alive and dead. Amen.
