

Brothers and Sisters, All

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend at the tomb of the great St. Francis of Assisi in the Basilica Church in Assisi (Italy), Pope Francis will formally sign a new papal encyclical on human fraternity. His first encyclical was *Lumen fidei* "The Light of Faith" (2013), the second, *Laudato si* "Our care for the common home" and now the third under the Italian title of *Fratelli tutti*. A papal encyclical is a formal communication of the Pope concerning some important aspects of the Christian faith. In the past, the encyclicals were largely addressed to bishops and priests, but in modern times, the message is addressed to all the faithful – and in some cases for all of humanity, like *Pacem in terris*, "Peace on earth" (1963) and the last one on care for the earth.

The title of the newest encyclical comes from St. Francis of Assisi's thirteenth century hymn, *Canticle of the Sun*. The inspiration of the theme and title of the encyclical and the place where it is formally signed are consistent with Pope Francis' papacy from the beginning. Since taking the name Francis, our Holy Father has tried to implement the saint's legacy, such as concern for the poor and the environment and interreligious dialogue.

The encyclical focuses on the theme of human fraternity and the importance of recognizing each other as brothers and sisters who form a part of the same global family. The theme takes on particular relevance given the dramatic situation in the world today in which the coronavirus pandemic is causing great suffering to millions of people in more than 188 countries and territories. Now more than ever, all of humanity must recognize that the wellbeing of each person and our planet is a moral imperative that cannot be ignored. When one part of the body suffers, the entire person suffers. When one part of our world suffers, we all suffer.

Pope Francis challenges all, including our leaders, to be bold in developing a new economy and a new form of politics that moves beyond the model of the haves and the have-nots. This call for a new social order is based on the gospel values of sharing, generosity and charity.

Like many great encyclicals of the past, this one will take years and perhaps decades for the rest of the world to catch up to Pope Francis' bold vision. He is not proposing a quick-fix to the ills of society, but a fundamental shift in our thinking and vision. We must move away from the selfish thinking of "what's in this for me" to how will this benefit *my brothers and sisters*.
