

Announcements Outside of the Parish CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The Diocese of Hamilton has decided to move forward with a Parish-focused capital campaign after a recent study found support from 83 percent of the respondents. The planning study was conducted from May through June by the Steier Group, a campaign consulting firm, and included more than 900 clergy and lay participants. Under the proposed campaign plan, 75 percent of the funds raised would go to the Parishes for projects of their choosing, 15 percent to diocesan ministries and 10 percent to support Parishes in need. World Meeting of Families

Dear Parishioners:

With all that was being reported about the Church in recent weeks, one thing that did take place and in a very positive way was the World Meeting of Families, August 21-26 in Dublin, Ireland.

Held every three years, this major international event brings together thousands of families from across the world to celebrate, pray and reflect upon the central importance of marriage and the family as the cornerstone of our lives, of society and of the Church. The event has at its heart the following key moments: the opening ceremony, the three day Congress, a festival of families and the solemn closing Mass presided by Pope Francis.

The conferences drew much reflection from the Apostolic Exhortation, *Amoris Laetitia ('The Joy of Love'*), published by Pope Francis in March 2016, following the Synods on the family held in 2014 and 2015. Teresa Hartnett, Director of the Family Ministry Office with the Diocese of Hamilton, led the delegation of families from the Diocese. She remarked how "we focused a lot on why we have to work to get things right as a family. Families impact children more than anyone else and they are our future." Hartnett also observed how Pope Francis' words of regret and contrition were favourably received by the families, in light of more revelations of clergy abuse of children and minors and the lack of accountability on the part of some Bishops.

Let us be thankful that in the midst of these difficult weeks for the Church, the vibrancy and the love of the families who participated demonstrated the beauty, the gift and blessing of all families for the life of the Church and society.
