

# Prayer, Penance and Atonement

## Dear Parishioners:

We continue to absorb the shocking news, once again, of Priests abusing minors, sexually and physically. Moreover, Bishops and Religious Superiors were complicit by moving predator Priests from one parish to another, rather than removing them from ministry outright and alerting the legal justice system.

As you know I addressed this issue in my homily two weeks ago. I again express my sorrow, shame and anguish for the victims and their family, and my frustration and anger toward the church leaders who perpetrated these heinous acts and those who failed to act. We have heard from our own Bishop, Douglas Crosby and from the Holy Father, Pope Francis. As I said, words are not enough and a concerted effort to protect the most vulnerable will only begin to restore some trust.

I also said how you, the laity, can help those in position of leadership in the Church to be accountable, truthful and transparent. These are certainly difficult days for all the members of the Church.

In light of all these recent events and tragic revelations, I invite you to participate with me this First Friday, September 7, in a day of prayer, fasting, penance and atonement. While such sins were committed by a fragment of the Church, the consequences and impact touch us all. In the longstanding Jewish tradition, the community comes together to atone for the sins of all, for even the sins of the few can leave deep scars and lasting pain for all. After Mass on Friday, we will have our Holy Hour of Adoration and a special litany invoking God's mercy. If you are unable to attend, I invite you to find the time that day to offer prayers for the victims, to offer a sacrifice and even to make a charitable contribution for organizations that help the young in our community.

While these symbolic acts are but small gestures, nevertheless, I believe in the power of prayer and the life of the Spirit who will move hearts and minds toward right action, justice, wisdom, love and healing.
