

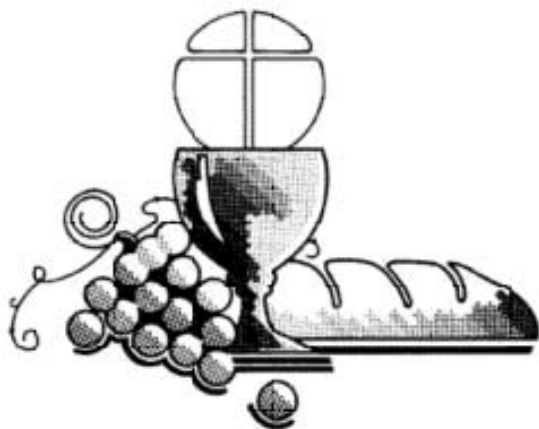

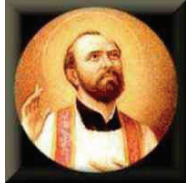
National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, September 30: In June of this year, the federal government passed a new legislation making September 30th a national statutory holiday commemorating National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. It commemorates the history and ongoing trauma caused by residential schools and to honour the survivors, families and communities who continue to grieve for those who were lost. A special Mass will be celebrated in our Parish and in all our Parishes throughout the Hamilton diocese. Everyone is encourage to join our Parish community in prayer on that day.

Parish Office: will be closed on September 30.

First Holy Communion: Has been rescheduled to **Saturday, October 2** at 11:00 am (children from Blessed Sacrament School) and 1:00 pm (children from St. Theresa and other schools. We ask that the children and family be at Church at least 15 minutes prior to the celebration. Given the restriction in terms of capacity, we will allow up to **7 family members** per child for the celebration. Please pray for the children and their families.

*Saint of the Day – October 1st
St. Therese of the Child Jesus
Virgin and Doctor of the Church*

Generations of Catholics have admired this young saint, called her the "Little Flower", and found in her short life more inspiration for their own lives than in volumes by theologians.

Yet Therese died when she was 24, after having lived as cloistered Carmelite for less than ten years. She never went on missions, never founded a religious order, never performed great works. The only book of hers, published after her death, was a brief edited version of her journal called "Story of a Soul." (Collections of her letters and restored versions of her journals have been published recently.) But within 28 years of her death, the public demand was so great that she was canonized.

Therese was born in France in 1873, the pampered daughter of a mother who had wanted to be a saint and a father who had wanted to be monk. The two had gotten married but determined they would be celibate until a priest told them that was not how God wanted a marriage to work! They must have followed his advice very well because they had nine children. The five children who lived were all daughters who were close all their lives.

Therese be known as the Little Flower but she had a will of steel. When the superior of the Carmelite convent refused to take Therese because she was so young, the formerly shy little girl went to the bishop. When the bishop also said no, she decided to go over his head, as well. Her father and sister took her on a pilgrimage to Rome. During an audience with the Pope, she begged him to let her enter the Carmelite convent. The Vicar General who had seen her courage was impressed and soon Therese was admitted to the Carmelite convent that her sisters Pauline and Marie had already joined. Her romantic ideas of convent life and suffering soon met up with reality in a way she had never expected. Her father suffered a series of strokes that left him affected not only physically but mentally. As a cloistered nun she couldn't even visit her father.

She knew as a Carmelite nun she would never be able to perform great deeds. *"Love proves itself by deeds, so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden me. The only way I can prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love."*
