



Racism: The Uncomfortable Conversation

By now we have seen again and again the unfortunate and disturbing images of Prime Minister Trudeau in black and brown face more than 15 years ago. As Canadians we pride ourselves for our openness and tolerance. Yet those disturbing images are a painful reminder of past art and entertainment that were an affront to racial minorities. The electorate will decide whether the apology and regret merit a second mandate. I don't believe our PM is a racist but I do believe he made a grave error in judgment.

Moving beyond the mistakes and pass transgressions of one politician, this moment provides us with a unique opportunity to address and acknowledge racism in all its forms, whether it be blatant, subtle or unconscious. When we target a particular group, when we use harmful humour or harbour resentment, we tap into a form of racism that is pervasive, deep and harmful to a society. Many times Pope Francis has called on people of faith to deal with racism head on and to call it what it is - sin. And it's not just personal sin, but systemic sin whereby privilege by one group is exercised at the expense of others. Ultimately racism diminishes our humanity and it is a disease that needs to be eradicated through honest dialogue, atonement, reconciliation and conversion. It's not easy to confront but we must begin the uncomfortable conversation.
