Gospel Reflection:

Jesus tells us he did not come to abolish the Old Testament Law, but to fulfill it. If the Law was there to provide the foundation, the bare minimum for honouring God we might say, Jesus came to show us how to go beyond that minimum foundation to a more full relationship with God. We need to grow beyond a legalistic relationship with God to one based on love of God and neighbour. It is a significant shift from obeying the Law because it contains the rules, to seeking to love God and our neighbour in action. A relationship based on just following the rules is not the same as one where we try to please the one we love. Love changes everything.

Understanding the Mass - Why for "the Many" and Not "for All"? During the consecration of the wine into the Blood of Christ, the priest prays: "...the Blood of the New Covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins". This is a change from the previous version of "for all" for an important theological reason. Jesus Christ suffered and died on the Cross so that all humanity might be redeemed from the power of sin and death. We all are redeemed because of Christ's suffering and death and not because of our personal worthiness but we do not get a 'free pass' into heaven. The choices we make in this life have eternal consequences and when we reject God's grace and refuse to repent of our sins, we separate ourselves from God. So, Jesus' suffering and death is not a guarantee that all will automatically be saved regardless of our choices but rather it provides the freedom for us to choose for or against God. This change in the Eucharistic Prayers makes it clear that our freedom to choose for or against God matters and that Christ's death is not a guaranteed 'free pass into heaven for all' because God respects our free will and our choices.
