#### **Sunday Reflection:**

Jesus' baptism is not the sacrament of baptism we typically celebrate with our infant children. One of the early saints wrote: "perhaps [Jesus] comes to sanctify his baptizer; certainly he comes to bury sinful humanity in the waters. He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake and in readiness for us; he who is spirit and flesh comes to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water" (Gregory of Nazianzus). For us, sacramental baptism is not about getting a spiritual passport and collecting our first stamp. Rather, baptism makes possible a filial relationship with God but our children need to be taught by our example how to live this relationship, what it means to be God's child and a servant of the kingdom, a brother or sister of Christ and a member of the Church. In the sacrament of baptism, parents and godparents affirm their faith in the Creed as part of the rite because it is this faith that their child will be taught. This is the faith context in which they will come to know and love God. Baptism is incorporation into God's family; how we live that relationship begins with the example of our parents and godparents and ultimately will depend on our own choices as we mature and grow. #### **Understanding the Mass – The Preface:**

The Prayer before the Eucharistic Prayer is called the "Preface". There are many different ones for the special celebrations during the liturgical year but the first part of all of the Prefaces is the same. It begins with "The Lord be with you" (and the people respond: "And with your spirit") and it continues with "Lift up your hearts". The people's response is: "We lift them up to the Lord". In the final part of the dialogue the priest says: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God" and the response is: "It is right and just". This response reflects the fact that thanking God is not only the right thing for us to do, but considering everything that God has done for us, it is the just thing to do as well! We owe God our thanks for His goodness and blessings and this response highlights that reality. We are not always accustomed to thinking that we owe God thanks but when we really think about it, it makes perfect sense. The rest of the Preface varies with each of the individual ones, but we will notice that the language in general follows the more formal and dignified way of speaking to God that we are now accustomed to using in the New Missal.
