**Gospel Reflection:** The Gospel begins with St. Luke's testimony – St. Luke was a very careful documenter of the life of Christ. You might say that he was the first investigative reporter: he sought out the people who knew Jesus and who had been witnesses to his ministry. In the second half of the Gospel, we hear Jesus read that well known passage from Isaiah where the prophet announces God's promise to send a saviour who would free us from our sins, release those held in captivity by sins and crippling guilt, to proclaim the time of God's favour. We know that Jesus did all of these things as a precursor to his ultimate mission of mercy - dying on the cross for our sins.

Understanding the Mass – Eucharistic Prayers After the Preface, we typically use one of four Eucharistic Prayers at Mass for the prayers that consecrate the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. The First Eucharistic Prayer (the Roman Canon) dates back to the fourth century under Pope Damasus I (who also commissioned St. Jerome to produce the Latin Vulgate version of the Bible). The Second Eucharistic Prayer is even older: its origins can be traced back to the third century. The Third Eucharistic Prayer was composed after the Second Vatican Council, and it resembles the Second Eucharistic Prayer in many ways. The Fourth Eucharistic Prayer is a little different because it is very similar to the ones used in the Eastern Liturgy of the Church (where it is called the *anaphora*). One difference with this fourth prayer is that it has its own proper Preface that must be used with it because the Preface and the Eucharistic Prayer form a seamless whole to present the entire history of salvation. In the Missal, the English translation is close to the Latin original. Isn't it amazing to know that we what we do closely resembles what the Church has celebrated for over almost 1,700 years in both the West and the East? Fr. Geoff

Message from Archbishop Damphousse about the "Called by Name" Programme: As you well know, we all have a part to play in asking the Lord to send out "labourers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38). Towards this end, I am asking for your assistance in implementing a programme intitled: 'Called by Name' in your parish. 'Called by Name' is a proven programme which promotes vocations by inviting specific trusted individuals (clergy, staff, etc.) to identify potential vocations in others. These trusted nominators are asked if they have sensed, in others, a call to the priesthood for men or consecrated life for women. Yes, I am quite aware that all vocations are important, but this year our resources only allow us to begin here. We will expand our efforts in the future years.

On Sunday (February 1 and 2), nominations will begin via the following link. Anyone is invited to make nominations. These nominating individuals are asked to think of people they feel could be called to the priesthood or consecrated life for women. Nominations will take place on an archdiocesan web page. (Those under 18 can be nominated, however, all diocesan contact with the nominee will be done via the parent or legal guardian.)

Nominees will then be invited to consider attending a follow-up discernment event to take place later in 2025. Details will be sent directly to those nominated.
