Gospel Reflection:

Jesus is asked: "Which commandment is first of all?" Our Lord's response is the prayer that devout Jewish people pray everyday. It is the foundation of the Jewish person's relationship with God: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might." Jesus adds to it "with all your mind" and he attaches a second commandment to it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." This addition also is found in the Old Testament. The novelty was in connecting the two together into a single commandment. These two commandments form the foundation of the life of a Christian. They belong together. They are not meant to take away our freedom but instead to provide us with the foundation for living our lives well in relationship with God and with each other based on love and service - not fear or entitlement.

Praying for the Souls of the Departed: Why do we pray for the souls of the departed? The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC, 1030) This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God..." (CCC, 1032) Let us pray for our beloved departed friends and relatives and also pray for those who do not have living family or friends to pray for them this November.

A **Memorial Book** has been placed in the Atrium. In this book, all parishioners are invited to inscribe the names of their family, relatives and friends who have died and who they wish to have remembered in the prayers that will be said for them during the month of November.


